Water Color Resist Flowers

I often see potted Kalachuchi plants along the route I take to work. The pink flowers continually bloom all year round and I must say that I've grown fond of seeing it every day. I find the pink variety very attractive (*another variety of this plant produces white flowers*) and I thought that it would make a great subject for an art work. This is the inspiration behind this lesson.



WHAT TO DO

Lightly draw a sketch of the Kalachuchi flower on the white paper. You may opt to look at an actual plant or take a photograph for you to copy. Once your sketch is final, color your work.

Coloring Your Sketch

Flowers: Color the flowers with light pink. Add a darker shade of pink in the middle of the flowers. Smudge the colors with your finger to blend it and create a smooth texture. Trace the outline of the flowers with a dark shade of pink.

Branches: Color the branches with light brown. Smudge the pastel to make the texture smooth. Trace the outline of the branches with dark brown. Add thick horizontal lines across each branch to create some sort of stripes.

Leaves: Color the leaves with light green. Trace the contours with dark green.

Water Color Resist: Paint the back ground with watercolor (for my sample, I used light yellow, medium yellow and pink). Paint over the oil pastel colored surface and see the paint pigments mark only the uncolored areas of your paper.

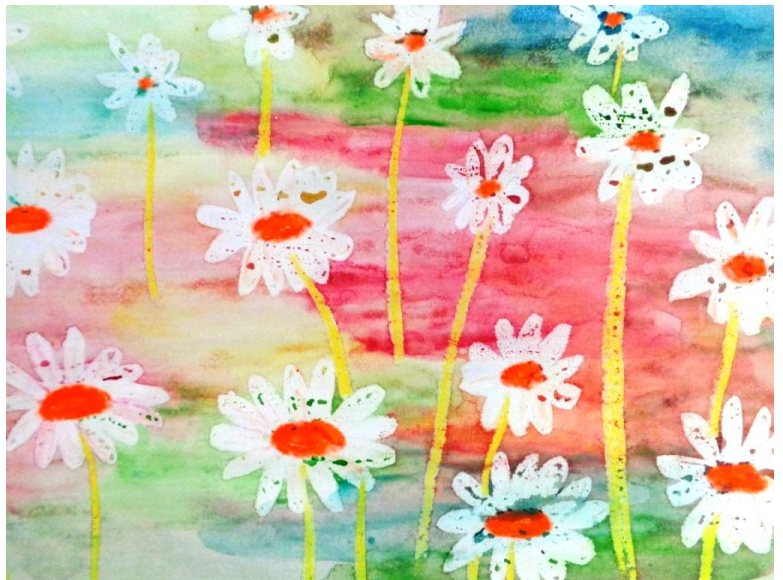
What You'll Need

- oil pastel
- paint brush
- pencil and eraser
- watercolor
- white paper
